Welcome from our Board

It has been an incredibly busy year for the club. We "officially" relocated to Riverside and saw the grand opening of the facility back in February this year. It has now been one full year since we were given access to train at Riverside. In the space of six months, we have hosted three large athletics competitions attended by 441 athletes from across Scotland, including the first ever Regional SUPERteams competition organised by Scottish Athletics. This was no mean feat and required the collective organising power of our amazing local volunteers.

We did fantastically well to remain in Division 1 of the Central and South of Scotland Athletic League and to qualify for the National Final of the Youth Development League as part of Team Ayrshire. It is easy to forget how challenging it is to organise teams for these league competitions. We thank our organisers, athletes, parents and carers for their contribution to these successes.



This year has been a significant year in terms of organising ourselves better and making changes that will ultimately improve how the club operates. We've enjoyed a variety of new programs and initiatives including Summer Camps and introducing Run, Jump, Throw sessions for 9–12-year-olds. We launched our first ever Couch to 5K programme back in January with the second block coming to an end in October. Our Development Officer has been delivering free athletics sessions as part of our project to engage the Ayr North community. Vital funds have been raised to purchase new training equipment and provide support to low-income families during the cost-of-living crisis.

We have a lot more work to do, especially when it comes to recruiting new volunteers and raising training standards across all athletics disciplines. We look forward to working with our dedicated coaches and volunteers to achieve these goals.
